- The workshop will work though a risk assessment process and associated community engagement. NCCARF's coastal and communication experts will assist you to use and explore the wide range of guidance material on CoastAdapt.

#### Prior to the workshop

- To get most from the workshop we recommend you read through the C-CADS material, community engagement information manual and first pass risk assessment information.
- You will be sent a Recommended Reading Kit to read prior to the training.
- Bring your own device—a laptop computer or tablet— to the workshop: a mobile phone will not be sufficient.

#### What will I get out of this?

- Following the training we encourage you to share your expertise of CoastAdapt with other users.
- Handouts with training notes and material to support any training exercises.
- A USB stick containing slide presentations to help you share information with colleagues.
- A Certificate of Attendance on completion.
- You may also be eligible to claim continuing professional development (CPD) points for professional organizations like EIANZ, Engineers Australia, or the Planning Institute of Australia.
